

Sharing A Holy Week

In the next seven days with Jesus, we are invited into some of the harshest, most devastating forms of betrayal, confusion, torture, death and then...the mystery of defeating death. This time will require the full measure of our compassion for him. What he went through was real. He was not faking or biding his time. The hurt and the hatred, the disappointment and his dying

were heaped upon the "Son of Man," the "human one," like you and like me.

Many of us will be in church more often than usual in the next week. We'll be there, of course, to pray, to be inspired by God's Word, Jesus, whose suffering and death took away finally our fear of death. For many, going to church is understood as a sort of "God and me" time. Of course this is true, but as with so many things about our faith, there's more.

Not only will you and I be present. There will be other Catholic Christians around us. By all appearances, they will be "fine." We might believe that, since they all appear fine, they actually are. Still it would be fair to look no further than your own life or mine. So many brothers and sisters like us are weighed down by concerns that trouble them deeply, cause them to lose sleep, haunt their waking thoughts. You may be someone who is dealing with physical pain that is unbearable Receive his gift of mercy and rejoice at the power of his victory!

some days and tolerable others, but never really goes away. Our families may be wondering how they will make it financially, with children in school and a grandparent with dementia or heart disease. While the faces of those around us don't show it, and the discussion of the day's weather makes it sound like nobody else carries the kind of weight you do, pleasant faces and small talk can mask a lot of reality hidden just below the surface.

Into just such lives, not only in this parish but *in every home* around the entire world, enters Jesus Christ. The events that we commemorate liturgically in the next week, Jesus lived in the flesh. He is God, but watch this week and you'll see just how human he is. He became flesh, like you and me to make sure that he would share – in every way – our own challenges, struggles as well as our joys. In this way Jesus is truly compassionate; he has actually suffered what we, his brothers and sisters, have suffered. It was devastating for him! But he saw that by means of his taking on all that we suffer, he would give us freedom. He would pave the way to not only surviving what we suffer but actually sharing with us his victory. We need not be frightened or controlled by fear of pain or death anymore. Jesus understands what we're going through and he is truly here to help us the way only someone who knows our suffering can help.

These next days, turn to Jesus, accompany him. Receive his gift of mercy and rejoice at the power of his victory!

EASTER TRIDUUM

The **Paschal Triduum**, often called **Easter Triduum** or simply, **Triduum**, begins during **Holy Week**, and consists of **Holy Thursday**, **Good Friday**, **Holy Saturday**, and **Easter Sunday**.

The word **Triduum** comes from the Latin word meaning "**three days**." It begins the evening of Holy Thursday and ends at Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday, thus the Triduum consists of three full days which begin and end in the evening. It is technically not part of Lent (at least liturgically), but Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday are still a part of the traditional forty-day Lenten fast.

The Triduum celebrates the heart of our faith, salvation, and redemption: the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It commemorates the passion, crucifixion, death of the Lord, his descent to the dead, and finally his glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday morning. The Triduum is one liturgical celebration that happens in three parts. Our Triduum celebrations are:



Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper

▶ 7:00 PM CTK Church ◆

This liturgy begins with the reception of the Holy Oils, blessed at the Chrism Mass the previous Tuesday at Sacred Heart Cathedral. Follow-

ing the Liturgy of the Word is the Washing of the Feet and the dressing of the Altar as we prepare to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Our liturgy ends with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose where we sit quietly with Jesus, as in the garden of Gethsemane, awaiting his betrayal, trial and crucifixion.

* Attendants will be on site to assist with parking on Holy Thursday.




Good Friday The Passion of the Lord

This liturgy begins with the lighting of the Easter fire outside of church followed by the blessing and lighting of the Paschal candle. We then process inside to hear the Word of God. After the homily, the Elect are invited to receive the sacraments of baptism and confirma-

tion and full reception into the Catholic Church. All present renew their baptismal promises claiming themselves for the Lord. The newly baptized make their first Communion during the Liturgy of the Eucharist. At the end of the liturgy, with joy, we proclaim, "He is Risen. Alleluia, Alleluia!"



Bike Pilgrimage to Saint Kateri Shrine ► SAT-TUE May 28–31: NEW DATES & REDUCED COST for this fun, spiritual journey!

Registration is underway for our parish pilgrimage to Fonda, NY on SAT-TUE, May 28 - 31. The cost for the trip is \$300. If you would like your own hotel room, then the cost is \$400. Our pilgrimage will be supported by a couple vehicles, so you will not need to carry all your belongings. You will be free to cycle at your own pace, meeting up with a support vehicle about every 10 miles for water & snacks. Meals are included with a picnic lunch planned each day about half way through the ride. The support vehicle allows you to shorten miles by providing a lift if you need!

Bike Pilgrimage Q&A

Why is the parish going to Fonda and why on a bike?

Fonda, which is located near the Erie Canal about 210 miles east of Rochester, is the birthplace of our parish's patron, Saint Kateri. It is where she first learned about Jesus from the Jesuit missionaries and where she was baptized at age 20. The bike pilgrimage to her shrine in Fonda is part of the celebration of the fifth anniversary of the creation of Saint Kateri Parish. Because there is a trail that runs along much of the canal, I thought it would be fun to make a pilgrimage there. Considering the time it would take to walk 210 miles, I thought to bike would be a good alternative.

What is the difference between a *bike tour* and a *pilgrimage*?

Calling this trip a *pilgrimage* instead of a *bike tour* emphasizes the spiritual nature of the trip. It is an opportunity for people of faith to enter a journey together on their way to a holy site. In a pilgrimage not only the destination, but also the journey, is holy. Prayer and helping each other along the way will be important aspects of the pilgrimage.

If I can't bike 210 miles, can I still participate?

Yes. We are seeking people willing to support the pilgrims on their journey. We are currently figuring out what kind of support they would need, but things like preparing the picnic lunches would be one example of support. Prayers are also helpful! This pilgrimage could be quite challenging physically. While we hope that those riding will train for the 210 miles, we expect that some riders will experience some difficulties along the way and might not be able to complete the miles on a particular day. In those cases, there will be a support vehicle that will collect them and take them to that day's destination.

If you question your ability, please contact a pilgrimage team members to discuss further.

What else do you want people to know?

A good night's rest and creature comforts are important,, so we are staying in hotels/motels. I am going to reach out to parishes along the route inviting them to consider preparing an evening meal for us. When we arrive in Fonda, we plan to celebrate a Mass and celebrate the Native American heritage of Saint Kateri. Also, right now, I think I am the youngest pilgrim. We would love to have some riders in the 18-40 age range. If you are a young adult or know of any who might be interested in riding, please let them know of this opportunity. Thank you!

The Corporal Works of Mercy were lived out again when petitions supporting quality child care for low income families were delivered to Governor Cuomo's and Legislative leaders in February. Four thousand six hundred signatures were collected from thirty-two parishes in Monroe County. Kudos to Saint Kateri for gathering 495 signatures - more than ten percent.

Diocesan Justice and Peace Staff visited Legislators to deliver petitions and advocated for the cause. The NYS Budget is in the process of being negotiated. Please continue to pray for a good outcome for this important strategy which helps parents stay employed by providing quality assistance for their children. The need is very real and this funding makes a tremendous impact on the quality of people's lives.
