Recently, I entered the room of a gentleman probably in his early sixties who adamantly replied saying "NO". He said when he was young he was a practicing Catholic but his time in military service ended everything. He couldn't align killing with receiving communion, so since then stopped going to church. I listened and then offered to say a prayer with him to ask Mary's help for his quick recovery. He started crying, kept repeating that he had killed people, and said he couldn't even pray because of what he had been forced to do. Crying uncontrollably, he gestured with his hand that he wanted to be alone. I don't know how his story ends, but I do know that, just as Mary let him open up and trust me, that she is by his side and will stay there as any good mother would.

It is amazing how God and Mary work through us if given the chance. When we pray to Mary we receive graces to do so. The Blessed Mother does not forget your devotion and, rest assured, she intercedes with her Son as your advocate. As at the wedding at Cana, Jesus will not refuse His mother anything asked of Him.

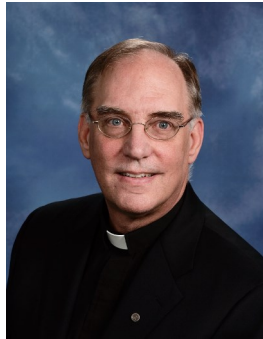

PASTOR'S REFLECTION



Try To Imagine Yourself Living In Peace

As I write this today I am praying for the people of Ecuador and Japan who suffered from devastating earthquakes. I'm also praying for my former neighbors in Southeast Texas, braving the effects of flooding from days of heavy rain. Add to that my prayers for a dear friend who has late-stage prostate cancer, and we realize that talk of peace can feel very far from the people in our lives and around the world. I haven't even touched the

fighting and low-level wars across the globe, using, in our age, highly sophisticated weaponry, nor have I said anything about the harsh way some treat their own family members, neighbors, fellow-citizens.

A few days ago a stabbing was reported locally, and I surprised myself with the thought, "Thank God, he didn't have a gun." Many people are choosing to arm themselves these days. In some states there is a movement for concealed or open carrying of firearms, not only in hunting areas, but in public, in the classroom, in church! Their reasoning? It's the way they feel safe.

Whether we're talking about guns, knives, missiles or fists, we're talking the language of whatever "peace" the world gives. In my time, these simply have not achieved peace; they in fact have ended up continuing and widening the deadly spiral of violence and mistrust. Guns, missiles, knives or fists "don't kill people," the saying goes, not on their own. They can't. But they do when a human motivated to do harm to another enters the picture. I always get the feeling when armed people get into conflict that "this won't end well."

What's the answer? When faced with all this danger and conflict, what can we do? Are we doomed to a world of hyper-armed humans mistrusting everyone and ready to kill or be killed? That is so far from peace that one is left wondering if we even know what peace is.

Jesus promises, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." Some, especially in social media, dismiss Jesus as a naive hippie because of sayings like this. They call such talk unrealistic, fanciful. My only question of these people is, "who created the universe? Was it you? Do you have all the answers? Or was it God, Jesus the Christ, who actually knows the way because he *is* the way?" Our faith tells us that Jesus Christ, our beloved brother and friend, is our only true peace, and that he intends to establish his true peace here on Earth. That's God!

What's your part and mine? It's to refuse the "answers," the "peace" the world propounds and to choose actively to cooperate with God's way. It means learning from Jesus in the Gospels. It means listening to his voice in the 2,000 years of wisdom of the Church. It means rejecting violence and death as "solutions," and choosing love and peace despite what anyone else demands.

It begins at home. It extends to our neighbors. We can start there. Now in this month of Mary, the Queen of Peace, God will show us how.

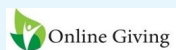

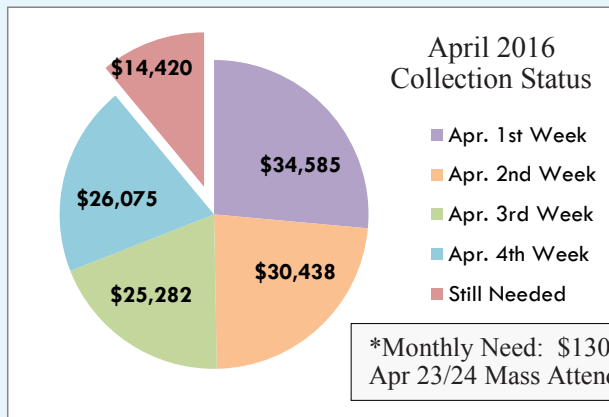
