# PART I: ST. SALOME'S CHURCH - THE MISSION CHURCH

The history of the Church of St. Salome is as much a part of the development of the Sea Breeze/Point Pleasant area and of the Rochester Diocese as these components are of the Church. This is especially true in the years of 1908-1925: The Mission Church in Sea Breeze.

Catholics from two German churches in the city regularly vacationed along the lakeshore in Sea Breeze. Parishioners from St. Francis Xavier and St. Michael's eventually petitioned Bishop Hickey and the pastor of St. Francis to annex a chapel in the area, which they would build.

The land was donated at the corner of Culver and Park Road by Mrs. Joseph (Salome) Boucher. Fundraisers to build the chapel began in 1907 with a moonlight excursion, a bowling contest and regular parties at St. Francis' and St. Michael's parish halls. Area funds came from a variety of sources. Contests, e.g. doll making, were run by the ladies.

The chapel was built at a cost of \$3000 and dedicated by Bishop Hickey to Mrs. Boucher's patron, St. Salome, on June 14, 1908. The services on Sunday would be attended to by the pastor of St. Francis Xavier, Father Joseph Netzel. *(cont. on page 2)* 



When he died the following year the chapel supervision was transferred to Father Jacob Staub of Holy Redeemer Church.

During this time the Sea Breeze/Point Pleasant area was becoming home to more people choosing to reside here. As always, this population swelled with the summer crowds. Mass was always well attended. One marriage is recorded from the chapel of St. Salome. Father Staub united George Ritter and Henrietta Burkard in matrimony on September 6, 1910.

As the days of autumn got colder and more people wanted to attend Mass year round, it was decided to put a furnace in the small wooden chapel. Unfortunately, this installation may have changed the course of local history.

The night watchman at the newlyopened Durand Eastman Park alerted the recently-formed Sea Breeze Volunteer Fire Department when he spotted flames erupting from the chapel in the early hours of October 11, 1910. It was too late to save the structure and in the pre-dawn hours, the first church of St. Salome burned to the ground.

When the chapel burned to the ground in 1910, Father Staub acted quickly and decisively. With a small collection from congregants as a down payment, he approached farmer John Zuber whose orchard across the street was ideally located to build a new, larger Mission Church.

Barely a year after the fiery destruction of the first St. Salome Mission Church, a larger Spanish-style church was dedicated on this spot in 1911 (*pictured on the right*). Father Staub continued to lead this growing church while serving as pastor of his congregation at Holy Redeemer. He also continued his activities in the Rochester area among the poor and working class.

Father Staub listened and encouraged his Sea Breeze/Point Pleasant (and further distant) church attendees when talk of having a Catholic school on the property began to circulate. During these times, it was seen as essential that every Catholic church have its own school. In this rural suburb, Catholic families' only option was to send their children to the Durand-Eastman School. Bishop Hickey, on receiving the petition from St. Salome's to build a school, hesitated, seeing this as only a possibility in the remote future.

Again, Father Staub acted quickly and decisively. Getting a friend to donate cinderblocks and organizing the men of the congregation, he began building St. Salome's School in 1921. It was near completion before Bishop Hickey became aware of the project. He sent for Father Staub to discuss this unauthorized work. The school remained.

In the early 1920's, Sea Breeze became a boom area. St. Salome's Church became a full-fledged Parish in 1925. Father Edward J. Eschrich was appointed pastor. He would establish a strong Catholic presence in the area.

Our St. Salome history continues in future bulletins.


