PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Looking Ahead Here At Saint Kateri Parish

Each school year for our children and young people brings thoughts and dreams of what the coming time of growth and learning will be like. We pack them off to school with hopes and expectations, and they arrive for their first day with enthusiasm and that annual sense of awe. Something amazing is about to begin, and everyone knows it!

It seems a parish also operates on the model of the academic year, doesn't it? Of course we have the official liturgical year beginning in late fall with the Advent season, moving through the entire year while honoring the gift of salvation we have in Christ and sharing as the family of the Roman Catholic Church. After our long, hot summer, activities start to gear up in the parish as well!

When I was a teacher in an earlier time in my life, it was clear to me that success with students and passing grades didn't just happen; they resulted from a good and clear plan. The same concept applies for any successful endeavor, including parish life! So I've been sitting with excellent advisors, both on staff and from among parishioners, to imagine what this coming parish year can be and planning how to get there.

We'll divide the coming year into four periods, each of which will focus on a particular aspect of our lives as Catholics and members of our Saint Kateri family. When we all pray about the same goal and pull in the same direction, God does amazing things through us. So I want to lay out for you the areas we as a parish community will be focusing on this year.

Coming right up is the first part of the year. Summer ends, fall begins. But during those times real life also is happening around us, each of us is going through our own situations. Some are enjoyable and beautiful; some challenging and deeply discouraging. The temperature under each of these intensifies with the challenges of our society and our town, with political realities and unrealities.

Some may be tempted to withdraw, saying, "What's the use?" Or grow angry, even bitter or fearful, and hang out with like-minded folks who are astute at criticism but short on helpful suggestions. But these "strategies" don't actually help anyone, do they? On the other hand, we can get together to *engage the challenges*. Biblically speaking, we can decide together to be salt of the earth and light for the world.

So this fall, we're going to look our world straight in the eyes, do a careful reading of the situations in the light of our own Vision and Mission and start seeing how we as a large and talented parish can make a real difference by stepping up and applying our collective voice and power. I find this prospect truly exciting!

In future weeks, I'll write about the three times to come. May God bless you in this last week before things get into *full swing*!



Anointing of the Sick - Please call the parish office or see a priest after Mass


