## PASTOR'S REFLECTION

#### Perfect Love Casts Out All Fear

The final weeks of the liturgical year lead us through visions of the end of time and the days of final judgment to the triumphant feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This weekend, then, since it is so near the end of this Liturgical Year of St. Luke's gospel, we are treated to some of the most frightening

descriptions contained in the Word of God: a time when evildoers will find themselves burnt like stubble, leaving them neither root nor branch. Jesus himself warns about the coming days of real calamity to be visited upon his own people: nation rising against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; powerful earthquakes, famines, plagues and awesome sights and mighty signs from the sky.

Jesus, in Luke's gospel, goes on to describe persecution of faithful people in those last times, but then he reassures them that because they will be filled with the Holy Spirit, God Himself will provide the words and the actions they will need to withstand mightily any opposition.

It's not hard to see why people, throughout the millennia, and in our time in particular, can see that these Biblical predictions are indeed happening in our time. One need only check the evening news (or the 24-hour news cycle we're blessed with in 2016) to be aware of things that sound very much like what the prophet Malachi predicted. What's interesting to me is the description that a professor of mine had for biblical prophecy, and its predictions of the future. The prophet can see that in the future, these several things will occur but his viewpoint is like looking through a keyhole, so he cannot tell what will happen in what sequence, how near or how far away the events are, or other vital details. He just knows they will happen. That means that those who wrote all the novels outlining exact timelines and identifying personages are excellent fiction, but that's the extent of it!

What we do know as Catholic Christians is what we say in our Apostles' Creed: He (Christ) will come to judge the living and the dead and of His Kingdom there will be no end. Thanks to the grace of His Sacrifice to free us from our sins, thanks to the wonderful Sacrament of Reconciliation in which we can confess our faults, sins and failures and hear Christ Himself say that we are forgiven and healed; thanks to the prayer we offer for one another, the Eucharist with which Christ gives us His very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity as food for our journey; thanks to these and many more graces that we receive as the family of our loving God, we do not fear the End, we do not fear judgment, we do not fear God! Instead, we honor Him and our brothers and sisters every time we share God's love, participate in God's plan of salvation for all by being disciples and evangelizers in our families, among our friends and acquaintances, wherever we find ourselves. No need to fear; only be faithful!




