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Ministry Report from: Carol Wilke, Director of Finance & Administration Date: April 21, 2017

- 1. What have you accomplished or worked on this month? What events or activities have you sponsored or presented? (please include numbers of participants and helpers)
- a. Highlights from March Statement of Revenues and Expenditures for St. Kateri Parish and School combined:
  - 1. Net Operating Income for March = \$113K and YTD = \$100K.
  - 2. Regular Collections are averaging \$28.5K per week (39 weeks) plus \$28.7K for Christmas.
  - 3. Tuition YTD (after financial aid) = \$395K. Number of students as of March 2017 = 195. PreK = 78, K = 14, Grade 1 through 5 = 103. Extended Care YTD = \$58K.
  - 4. Rental Income YTD = \$91K from external organizations including LMC, BOCES, Sisters of St. Joseph, American Tower.
- b. Fundraising Net Income YTD (after expenses):
  - 1. Bingo and Bell Jar \$5K, Raffle \$13K, Golf \$4K, Wreathes and Ornaments \$3K, St. Pauly Box \$3K.
  - 2. Walk a Thon \$11K, Kidz Stuff Coupons \$4K, General Funds for Chrome Books \$4K, Book Fair \$1K. Bill Gray's \$0.5K and Niagara Candy \$5K.
- c. Donations:
  - 1. Welcome Center \$5K, St. Kateri Statue \$5K, General \$18K, Social Ministry and St. Vincent dePaul \$6K.
  - 2. School \$78K.
- d. Bequests:
  - 1. Parish \$10K.
  - 2. School \$69K.

- e. Ministries and Programs:
  - 1. CYO \$4K Net Income YTD.
  - 2. Irondequoit Senior Ministry and Good Samaritan Transportation \$13K Net Income YTD.
  - 3. Parish Services: 140 Funerals, 16 Weddings, 87 Baptisms through April 21, 2017.
- 2. What are the current or active plans and dreams you are working on or discussing?
- a. Catholic Ministries Appeal Goal \$220K. As of April 18, 2017, Pledges from 1,132 Donors = \$212K (includes match of \$29K). Parish is at 96% of Goal. Shortfall = \$8K.
- b. Estimate for tree clean-up at St. Margaret Mary Church = \$2K.
- c. Total cost to demolish vacant storage shed on St. Cecilia property and excavate / install stone to enlarge parking area = \$37K.
- d. We welcome donations to fund projects on a wish list that includes new windows for St. Kateri School \$130K, new carpet at St. Cecilia Church, replacement runners at St. Margaret Mary Church, new controls to replace existing Johnson system in boiler room at Christ the King Church \$6K, automatic door operator at Christ the King Church \$5K.
- e. Delaney Marketing has been retained as a consultant at St. Kateri School for six months January through June 2017. Total cost = \$21K. Sr. Kay Lurz will share strategy and marketing plan at a future date.
- f. The 2017-18 Preliminary School Budget was reviewed with Diocese on March 22, 2017. Projected Enrollment for PreK = 83, Kindergarten through Grade 5 = 115 for a total number of 198 students. Registrations so far are approximately = 170. Tuition for first child in family (five full days) = \$4,095. Financial aid based on need is available. Operating Expenses for school = \$1,405K, approximately \$7K per student.
