a. Childcare Issues: 462 People signed Diocesan petitions asking NY State to increase funding for quality child care for low income families. The parish website and bulletin had excellent information about how this can change lives for families. Volunteers were at each of the Masses on Feb. 6 & 7 to answer questions and invite people to sign the petition.

b. Our local Diocese of Rochester Deanery is also looking at measures that parishes take in response to the poverty in our communities.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha 2015 Giving Tree Program Summary.

DONATIONS:

For Thanksgiving: Turkeys and other food for Thanksgiving dinners for about 60 families were donated and delivered to St. Francis Xavier Cabrini parish.

For Christmas, we packed about 160 boxes of food and gifts for 76 families, with a total of 346 individuals. These families were referred by the House of Mercy, the Villa of Hope and our parish.

Another 40 families from St. Francis Xavier Cabrini parish and 30 children from the Villa of Hope received gifts, totaling about 200 individuals.

VOLUNTEERS:

We are very grateful for the many volunteers who make this project possible. A rough estimate of the number of people who helped, based on the various tasks that had to done, is about 300 people. Some helped with more than one task in the entire process, so the number of actual volunteers may be less. This project requires many person hours. Thank you to everyone involved!

Of course, we also thank the people who donated food, gifts, gift cards and cash so that Saint Kateri was able to supply food for 136 families between Thanksgiving and Christmas and gifts for a total of 544 individuals at Christmas.

Tasks done by volunteers:

- 1. Preparing gift tags and envelopes: Typing, cutting, hole-punching and tying yarn.
- 2. Moving and storing donations of food and gifts.
- 3. Sorting the food donations by category and gifts by family.
- 4. Packing gifts for each family.
- 5. Picking up fresh food from Herrama's.
- 6. Packing food boxes for each family.
- 7. Delivering donations to St. Frances Cabrini Parish of Thanksgiving food and Christmas gifts.
- 8. Delivering food and gifts to 50 families at their homes.
 - a. Each family was called to make sure they would be home to receive the delivery.
 - b. Maps were prepared for the volunteer drivers.
- 9. Villa of Hope staff came to pick up the donations for their clients.
