



# PASTOR'S REFLECTION Catholics and Our Political Decisions

This weekend, I share small portions of a longer teaching by the

United States Catholic Bishops about Faithful Citizenship. I strongly recommend you read the entire document; see the USCCB website (link below\*).

The political realities of our nation present us with opportunities and challenges. We are a nation founded on "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness," but the right to life itself is not fully protected, especially for unborn children, the terminally ill, and the elderly, the most vulnerable members of the American family. We are called to be peacemakers in a nation at war. We are a country pledged to pursue "liberty and justice for all," but we are too often divided across lines of race, ethnicity, and economic inequality. We are a nation of immigrants, struggling to address the challenges of many new immigrants in our midst. We are a society built on the strength of our families, called to defend marriage and offer moral and economic supports for family life. We are a powerful nation in a violent world, confronting terror and trying to build a safer, more just, more peaceful world. We are an affluent society where too many live in poverty and lack health care and other necessities of life. We are part of a global community charged with being good stewards of the earth's environment, what Pope Francis calls "our common home," which is being threatened.

Some question whether it is appropriate for the Church to play a role in political life. However, the obligation to teach the moral truths that should shape our lives, including our public lives, is central to the mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ. Building a world of respect for human life and dignity, where justice and peace prevail, requires more than just political commitment. Individuals, families, businesses, community organizations, and governments all have a role to play. Participation in political life in light of fundamental moral principles is an essential duty for every Catholic and all people of good will.

The Church is involved in the political process but is not partisan. She cannot champion any candidate or party. Our cause is the defense of human life and dignity and the protection of the weak and vulnerable. The Church is principled but not ideological. As St. John Paul II wrote in *Sollicitudo Rei Socialis*, "The Church's main aim is to interpret the complex realities of human existence, determining their conformity with or divergence from the lines of the Gospel teaching."

We are committed [uncompromisingly] to clarity about our moral teaching and to civility, to the practice of the virtues of charity and justice that are at the core of our Tradition, working with others in a variety of ways to advance our moral principles.

In light of these principles and the blessings we share as part of a free and democratic nation, we bishops vigorously repeat our call for a renewed kind of politics: 1.) Focused more on moral principles than on the latest polls, 2.) Focused more on the needs of the weak than on benefits for the strong and 3.) Focused more on the demands of narrow interests.




