CMA

M. Fasano reported that the talks at Masses went well. There is a social media plan in place (with the help of J. Bounds) to educate everyone where CMA funds are used. Bulletin blasts and a video of people who have benefitted is in process. We are at 32% of goal (405 donors) as of 10/24/2017. A display at the churches will visually track new donor progress.

- The 4 week series "Walk through the Mass" went well

This was an excellent extension after Steve Angrisano weekend. This is a huge parish and we need to guard against alienation or small community. Calling parishioners into communities (like Suppers 8)

- Busy with ongoing leadership and staff matters
- Disappointed that the town turned down the St. Thomas school proposal as carrying the property is challenging as our budget is tight

- Still looking for suggestions for people to help brainstorm ideas and organize action items
- Still looking for a youth representative on Pastoral Council
