Ministry Report from: Mark Keller – Liturgy

Date: January 22, 2018

1. What have you accomplished this month? What activities have you sponsored?

As one might expect, this has been a busy month for the liturgy team. Our volunteers did well in decorating the churches for Advent, and did a great job in a short amount of time making the switch to Christmas. St. Kateri welcomed 3367 worshipers during the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses.

2. What are the plans and dreams you're currently discussing??

We are gearing up for the Lenten and Easter seasons. Using lessons learned from our most recent busy season (Christmas), we are going to reach out for volunteers for the additional Masses and services earlier, and will make sure the ministers (particularly the Sacristans and Hospitality Ministers) have the information they need to anticipate the crowds.

At the suggestion of the Staff Liturgy Team, the Parish Liturgy Committee is designing an evaluation process for our liturgies. This evaluation process will proceed on two fronts. First, the Liturgy Committee will evaluate liturgies across churches and Mass times to review the "technical" proficiency of the various ministries (e.g. – are the readers/commentators prepared to effectively proclaim the word, are the servers properly trained, etc.). Second, we will solicit feedback from the parishioners about their experience of the Mass. Once we gather the information, we can work to provide effective formation for our liturgical ministers and stimulate the spirituality of the parishioners.



Ministry Report from: Carol Wilke, Director of Finance & Administration Report Date: January 22, 2017

- 1. What have you accomplished or worked on this month? What events or activities have you sponsored or presented? (please include numbers of participants and helpers)
- a. St. Kateri Parish and School Net Operating Income for November YTD was-\$141K, December was -\$17K, YTD -\$158K. Highlights include:
  - 1. Regular Collections YTD are \$704K (\$27K per week for 26 weeks), \$12K for Holy Days, and \$33K for Christmas.
  - 2. Average Mass attendance (based on the month of October 2017) was 1,606 versus 1,773 in October 2016. The reduction of 167 represents 9%.
  - 3. Newly registered families since July 1, 2017 = 32, partially offset with a decline of six families.
  - 4. December School Enrollment = 201 (increase from 194 prior year). Pre-Kindergarten = 93, Kindergarten through Grade 5 = 108. Registration Fees \$21K, Extended Care \$35K.
  - 5. Rental Income YTD is \$28K from external organizations, including BOCES, Sisters of St. Joseph, Basilian Fathers, and American Tower.
- b. Fundraising Net Income YTD (after expenses):
  - 1. Golf \$8K (½ Parish, ½ PBA Nightstick Club), \$t. Pauly Box \$3K, Christmas Ornaments \$1K.
  - 2. Walk a Thon \$14K, \$ave Around ROCHESTER \$4K, Book Fair \$1K, Upcoming Bill Gray's and Niagara Candy.
- c. Donations YTD:
  - 1. Parish = \$33K, includes Social Ministry Gift Cards.
  - 2. School = \$7K (with expected match of \$5K).

- d. Bequests YTD: Parish \$1K
- e. Ministries and Programs:
  - 1. CYO Net Income YTD \$20K. Registrations \$22K (16 teams, 175 players), Season Passes and Admissions \$5K, partially offset with expenses for uniforms, safety equipment, and Field House rental.
  - 2. Irondequoit Senior Ministry Donation \$7K. Good Samaritan Transportation Donations \$3K.
  - 3. Parish Services: 103 Funerals, 7 Weddings, 49 Baptisms.
- f. Liturgical Publications Royalty: \$2.5K annually for five years
- g. Auxiliary Receipts (less expense) YTD:
  - 1. Memorials \$1K.
  - 2. Flowers \$4K revenue less \$2K expense.
  - 3. Liturgy Supplies (candles, wine, hosts, and palms) largely offset with candle money.
  - 4. Courier Journal YTD -\$27K (\$55K annually).

Ministry Report from: Mary Ann Noto & Donna Moll

Date: Dec. 18, 2017

1. What have you accomplished or worked on this month? What events or activities have you sponsored or presented?

The Advent Giving Tree Program this year served over 500 individuals. 64 families received food baskets – consisting of 3-6 boxes of food. These families also received gifts for each individual. Another 44 families- 206 individuals- from St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (SFXC) parish received gifts. Food and gifts were delivered Saturday and Sunday, Dec. 16 & 17. The program was based at the SC site, following the recommendations of the committee involved in the GRQC assessment, Parishioners from all over the parish were involved in making this work. It went very well. The committee will assess the program and make a more complete report later in January, with an estimate of volunteer hours and numbers.

Thanksgiving food, including 73 turkeys, was delivered to SFXC parish on Nov. 19<sup>th</sup>. SFXC had accepted applications from 72 families for these meals, provided by Saint Kateri Parish. The 73rd turkey was given to a woman who had just arrived from Puerto Rico.

Regular responsibilities listed last month continue: There were multiple funeral preparations and baptisms sessions, which are often outside regular office hours. Weekend liturgy preparations and serving as staff at Liturgies. Business office support: we are both designated to review and sign parish checks.

2. What are the current or active plans and dreams you are currently working on or discussing?

Evangelization Post Funeral /bereavement programs. We are meeting with Theo Munsen of Lifetime care to discuss how we can support our parishioners after the funerals of loved ones.

As stated above, we will participate in the evaluation of the unified Advent Giving Tree program to determine what worked and what could work better.

We are worked with the rest of staff to prepare for the Christmas Masses. This is the first year all three churches will have 4 PM masses on Dec. 24.

Each site had an opportunity for children to participate in the liturgy. Jessica Tette and Faith formation focused on the SMM Mass. Mary Ann and Donna were at SC and CTK respectively. Parishioners are involved in each of these programs.

Dec 24 is the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent, so preparing each Church for Christmas was a special challenge this year.
