SYNOD

ICE CREAM DISCUSSIONS

In October 2021, the Diocese of Rochester (DOR) joined Pope Francis and the Universal Catholic Church in the diocesan phase of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, on the theme "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission."

The parish got a late start, but we still collected information for a brief period of time from those willing to participate in the on-line survey and from several discussions made at various ministry gatherings.

The DOR reviewed incorporated our input with almost 500 pages of summaries from the synodal gatherings and individual responses. The results indicate several overarching themes. Key points are:

- A lack of clarity regarding the very basic question of Catholic identity, and what it means to be Catholic.
- The tensions and commonalities on the question of Catholic identity woven through the other overarching themes of: polarization, the impact of Covid, the need for evangelization, and challenges in decision-making.

FROM THE DEACON'S DESK

*Compassion is a way of life—
an inner posture of how to be with suffering,
both our own and others, and a desire to move that attitude into action.*

I am most thankful for my recent *Boundless Compassion* retreat. This is a four-day transformative process which was developed by Joyce Rupp. It is based on the core content of the book, *Boundless Compassion*. I stayed for a fifth day so I could complete the training and certification so I am now a *Boundless Compassion* facilitator that can lead these retreats open to people of all faiths and spiritualities.

The retreat provided me the opportunity to explore the depth of many-layered components of compassion based on the teachings of Christianity and other religious traditions. Presentations include insights from theology, spirituality, sociology, science, ecology, and psychology. In order to integrate these teachings into daily life, the retreat included quiet reflection times and small group dialogue. This four-day retreat was much needed as I continue to work with those in our parish who are suffering from personal loss or stress. It also served as a catalyst for a renewed commitment to be a compassionate presence for myself and for others who experience suffering.

I will be incorporating what I have learned from the *Boundless Compassion* in a retreat for the deacons of the diocese in November, a retreat for staff at another parish, and have been invited to work with the Mercy Spirituality Center in Rochester. I would also like to give Saint Kateri a retreat or two to small groups at our parish this fall.
